Caring by promoting health equity and better outcomes through access to high-quality and inclusive services for the people in our area.






Financials for 2019 Fiscal

Inter-Professional Primary Care Team Funding

We received special funding to create an Inter-Professional Primary Care Team from the Central East Local Health Integration Network. The funding allowed us to hire a Nurse Practitioner, Therapist and Indigenous Health Promoter to support clients in West Durham.

This funding focuses on improving and enhancing the health care experience by offering easy access to other relevant health care professionals while allowing the patients/clients to keep their primary care provider. Referred patients/clients can access the many programs and services that Carea offers without changing their family doctor.

Client Success Story

One of our therapists recently worked with a 22 year old female client with anxiety, depression and active suicidal ideation and self harm. She was also struggling with functioning independently and had become very dependent on her family.

After 8 consecutive sessions and 3 booster sessions over 12 months of Dialectic Behaviour Therapy (DBT) and Cognitive Behaviour Therapy (CBT), the client has seen an extinction of active suicidal ideation and self harm. She has also significantly increased her independent functioning and has seen her anxiety and depression decrease.

She is currently functioning well with as needed booster sessions to support her ongoing success.



A 10 year old boy struggling with anxiety joined our Calm Kids Group with his parents. He became very engaged and interactive with the group. His parents and teachers noticed a positive difference in him. The young client said he found the new skills he learned to be very valuable. He also found it helpful to be around other kids who experienced anxiety – it helped him not feel so alone.

The young client began offering support to the other kids in the group and provided them with encouragement. He stated that the Calm Kids Group helped him a great deal and he did not want it to end!
